PRIVACY AND COOKIE POLICY

Stichting KidsRights (hereinafter: “KidsRights” or “we”) values the protection of your personal data and transparency in relation thereto. This privacy statement describes how we collect, share, use and/or otherwise process information through which the person(s) that make use of our website, platform or service can be identified or is/are identifiable (“personal data”).

KidsRights is responsible for the processing of personal data collected via our websites and/or as provided by you and/or your child (as ‘user’) in view of your registration with and/or use of the State of Youth Kids platform (hereinafter referred to as “State of Youth Kids”).

KidsRights processes and treats personal data in accordance with the provisions of the European General Data Protection Regulation (“GDPR”), this privacy statement and any other applicable laws or regulations.

2.Types of personal data and processing purposes

Registration with State of Youth Kids

- When you want to register and become a Member of State of Youth Kids, we process the following types of personal data:
 - Username
 - Date of birth user
 - Country
 - Email address of your parent/guardian
 - Other content (e.g., personal data when you upload a picture of your challenges accomplished)

If your child is a Member of State of Youth Kids, we will collect and use the provided data to process the membership, to give you information about our work and (the initiatives in connection with) KidsRights and the State of Youth community. If you no longer want to receive our general information newsletters, you are able to opt-out at any time via a link in the email.

Making a donation as Supporter of KidsRights

- As a parent or guardian, you may also make a donation to KidsRights. In order to process such a (periodic) donation, we request the following types of personal data:
- First and last name
- Email address
- Banking details (e.g., IBAN or credit card details)

If you are a monthly Supporter, we will collect and your data to process your donation(s), give you information about our work, KidsRights and (the initiatives in connection with) State of Youth and State of Youth Kids, to ask for your support and / or to thank you for your support. If you no longer want to receive such newsletters, you are able to opt-out at any time via a link in the email.

Only Supporters from the age of 18 years can donate without the consent of a parent or legal guardian. If you are below the age of 18, it is only possible to donate up to 10 euros and with the consent of your parent/guardian.

Using the State of Youth Kids platform

While using our platform, websites or connected services, we collect and use the following personal data:

- IP address and device type (anonymized)
- Cookies and (anonymized) usage data on how our website is used
- If you contact is via the contact page on our website, we will also process your name and email address and any other information you provide voluntarily in order to respond to your question or inquiry.

3.Lawful basis for processing

KidsRights processes your personal data on the basis of consent, performance of contract, to comply with a legal obligation or when we have a legitimate interest to do so and provided the privacy rights of you or the user do not prevail in that context.

4.Minors

KidsRights does not intend to collect personal data from users under the age of 16 years without the consent of a parent or legal guardian. If someone younger than 16 years wants to become a Member of State of Youth Kids, he or she must indicate that a parent or guardian agrees when an account is created. In addition, the parent or legal guardian will need to accept and activate the account creation and the processing of personal data in the context thereof.

KidsRights encourages parents and guardians to be involved in the online activities of their children, in order to prevent that data about the children is being collected without their consent. If you are convinced that we have collected personal information about a minor without this permission, please contact us at info@stateofyouthkids.org and we will delete this information.

5.Sharing personal data with third parties

KidsRights will not sell your personal data to third parties. The personal data will only be made available to third parties if you have provided your consent, if this is necessary for the performance of our agreement with you, or if we are legally obliged to do so.

With companies that we appoint to process personal data on our behalf (e.g., payment service providers, fundraising agencies), we have concluded a data processing agreement to ensure an adequate level of security and confidentiality of the personal data involved. KidsRights remains responsible for the processing of the personal data involved.

6. Protection and retention of your data

KidsRights takes the protection of personal data seriously and takes appropriate measures to prevent misuse, loss, unauthorized access, unwanted disclosure and unauthorized modification thereof.

We retain the personal data no longer than is necessary for the purpose for which we have collected the personal data, or in correspondence with an applicable statutory retention term. You may at all times request the (early) removal of the personal data. We will inform you if the request for removal is allowed, in which case we will remove your personal data without delay.

We believe it is important that your personal data is stored as much as possible within the European Economic Area ("EEA"). Where your data is stored outside the EEA, we ensure that this is in accordance with privacy legislation and that the required level of protection is guaranteed.

7. Cookies

On our websites we place cookies. A cookie is a small text file that is stored in the browser of your computer, tablet or smartphone when you visit the website. KidsRights only uses functional cookies and analytical cookies that do not infringe your privacy. The cookies ensure that the website works properly and remember, for example, your preferences (e.g., language settings). The cookies also help us to optimize the website and to enhance the user experience.

You can opt out of cookies by setting your internet browser in such a way that it does not store cookies anymore. In addition, you can also delete all information previously saved via the settings of your Internet browser.

8. Your rights

You have the possibility to access your personal data, to receive an overview of your personal data and, in case of incorrect data or when we, based on the relevant laws and regulations, no longer need the data, to delete the data. You also have the right to data portability. This means that you can submit a request, in which you ask us to send you, or another organization, the personal information we have of you in a computer file.

Next to this, you have the possibility to revoke the permissions you've provided us for the processing of some of your personal data or request us to limit the use of your personal data.

All such requests may be directed to us in writing or through email via the contact details above. After receipt, we will assess your request and respond thereto within the applicable statutory term of four weeks.

To ensure that the request for access has been made by you, we may ask you to send a copy of your identification with the request. Please make your ID/passport photo, MRZ (machine readable zone, the strip with numbers at the bottom of the passport), passport number and citizen service number (BSN) black in this copy. This is to protect your privacy.

9. Question or complaint

If you have the impression that your personal data is not properly secured or if there are indications of misuse, please contact us via the above contact information. You may also file a complaint through our complaint procedure <https://kidsrights.org/about-kidsrights/contact/complaint-procedure/>.

KidsRights also wants to point out that you have the opportunity to file a complaint with the relevant national data protection authority. For the Netherlands this is the Autoriteit Persoonsgegevens.
